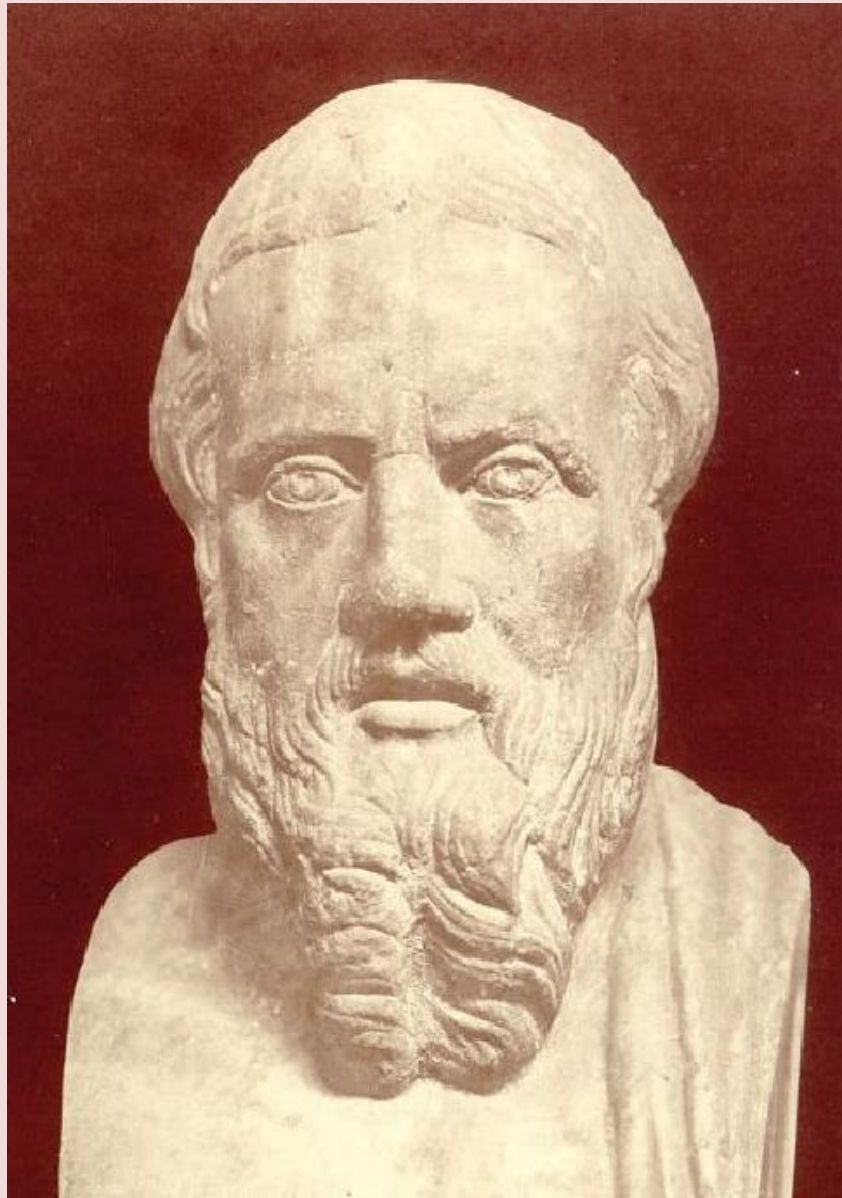

This publication marks the launching of the first peer-reviewed issue of the Athens Journal of History of the Athens Institute for Education and Research (ATINER). ATINER has been involved in the organization and hosting of a multitude of Conferences and Symposiums in the past, and even though it has produced numerous publications in the form of, inter alia, books, abstracts, and an online paper series, there has been a growing need to recognize outstanding papers, and thus the idea was conceived of having papers of such distinction published in journals.

The Athens Journal of History encourages and supports scholarly studies that focus on all aspects of history, broadly defined. Contributors may focus on any chronological period, from prehistory up to recent events, and on any geographical area, and should not feel limited to a discipline or subfield. Papers on cultural history, intellectual history, and social history are as welcome as a study of a particular epochal moment, while new critical methodologies like processual archeology, gender and feminist theory, historical materialism, new historicism, poststructuralism and structuralism, and transnationalism are as encouraged as any traditional historical analysis.

The Athens Journal of History is committed to a double-blind review process and assesses a submitted article on the following criteria: understanding of the bibliography, the author's contributions to the topic, the soundness of the methodology applied in the paper, and the plausibility of the conclusions. Proper and correct English is essential, and a paper not demonstrating a high level of polished English will not be considered. Finally, an author may be assured that he or she will be provided professional, constructive, and timely feedback by the outside reviewers.

With the introduction of the Athens Journal of History, which, it is envisaged, will be published quarterly, it is hoped that an enhancement of our knowledge in the various fields of study recognized under the umbrella term of 'history' will be realized. As editor, I am joined in this endeavor by a truly excellent Editorial Board, as well as highly competent publishing support at ATINER.
